For 45 years, ESRA has been dedicated to making Olim feel at home in Israel by providing essential services, enriching activities, and a platform to give back. As Israel's leading English-speaking volunteer organization with over 2,000 dedicated volunteers nationwide, we develop and run life-changing projects with strategic partners that ensure equal opportunities for all. Through these initiatives, English speakers become valuable contributors to Israeli society by donating and volunteering.

October 7 changed all our lives. Like you, we deeply hope for the safe return of all hostages and pray for the wellbeing of our brave soldiers. Our hearts go out to those who have lost loved ones, and we stand in solidarity with their families.

In 2024, **ESRA invested NIS 11.8M in the community**, including NIS 2.75M from strategic partners and NIS 2.9M in volunteer hours. **22,700 English speakers** participated in our activities and services, supporting their Aliyah journey from absorption to contribution. Additionally, **6,470 disadvantaged children**, **students**, **and war-affected families** received essential social welfare and educational support.

NIS 399,000 was provided to 240 war-affected families, welfare recipients and Olim, raising total financial first aid since October 7 to NIS 702,000. Requests came through field social workers in Kibbutz Be'eri, Sderot, Kiryat Shmona, Metula, Mevu'ot Hahermon, and more, marking a 29% impact growth and strengthening beneficiaries' resilience and opportunities.






Total Income 2024 - NIS 11.1 M*

ESRA War Effort

Financial First Aid

NIS 399,000 was provided to 240 war-affected families, welfare recipients, and Olim, often within 72 hours of request, bringing total direct aid since 7 October to NIS 702,000. Requests were made via field social workers in Kibbutz Be'eri, Sderot, Kiryat Shmona, Metula, Mevu'ot Hahermon, and more.

Education in Crisis

3,650 students received urgent support, including expanded aid (51% increase over 2023), adapted programs for evacuated children, and a new STEM initiative in the North.

Building Resilience

40 workshops provided emotional guidance and skill-building for reservists' families, bereaved individuals, and those facing war-related trauma.

Community in Action

1,000+ volunteers mobilized to deliver food, essentials, and knitted goods for soldiers and babies, with our secondhand shops leading community support.



ESRA War Effort: For English Speakers

Emotional Support



One-on-one sessions and support circles, led by social workers and trained volunteers for parents of soldiers and those coping with anxiety.

ESRA Friendship Service provided support for the elderly by trained volunteers.

Social Activities



Online and in-person interactive activities and events for stability, relief, connection and enrichment for the whole family.

Monthly tours to Israel's South united English speakers across Israel in acts of support and solidarity.

Bi-monthly webinars and expert-led meetings provided reliable guidance on key systems for knowledge and practical assistance.





Beyond Bridging Gaps - We Elevate


This project unlocks opportunities for ESRA SBC graduates and 6th-8th graders in Akko and Haifa who may otherwise never have had access to such resources. The program is mentored by 8 ESRA scholarship students, participants engaged in hands-on learning at the Haifa Technion and the multinational corporation, Intel Corp.

Participants learn to code, build, and program their own computers using Intel-provided kits, develop problem-solving and soft skills and improve their STEM English with guidance from ESRA ETP volunteers — all preparing them for future success.

The project is made possible through partnerships with Intel, local municipalities, the Engineering College and the Israel Air Force.


ESRA provides financial and emotional support through its Welfare, Friendship, and Counseling services, ensuring no one has to face these challenges alone.
